



How do I apply?

We recommend coming in to Evergreen and talking with us.

We will ask you some information about yourself and assess if our program can best serve you or if a referral to another agency is appropriate.

Our Housing Program typically has a waiting list, but depending on your situation, we may be able to help you quickly.

All our programs are voluntary and may end at any point youth feel ready to self-sustain.

Every person should have access to a safe, stable home.

Homeless? Couch hopping? We can help.

Struggling youth ages 17-24 are encouraged to come in and apply for Housing assistance. We may be able to subsidize your rent and/or utilities to make your independence a reality.

We also help with education, employment, parenting, counseling, budgeting, relationships, etc.

Our goal is to support you while reaching **your** goals.

We are a low-barrier program.

That means things like lack of income, existing criminal background, and chemical dependency issues **do not** exclude you from our program.

Behind on rent? Unexpected car repair? Unaffordable security deposit?

Emergency Assistance

You may qualify for a one-time assistance if:

- You are currently homeless, at-risk of being homeless, lack a regular place to stay at night, are overcrowded, or lack running water/electricity where you are staying.
- You can show that, with this one-time assistance, you will be able to maintain your housing, job, etc.

Transitional Living Program

You may be eligible if you are:

- Homeless – have nowhere to go, sleeping in your car, a tent, etc.
- At-risk of homelessness
- Overcrowded
- Do not have a regular place to stay at night
- Living without water/electricity
- Fleeing violence at home or with your partner or unsafe at home

Here's what you'll need to do in the program:

- Be willing to meet with a Case Manager weekly
- Write your own goals and work toward them. Our staff can help you figure out where you want to go and help you come up with a plan to get there.
- Turn in documentation at your Case Manager's request.



Permanent Supportive Housing

Youth who have experienced things like:

- Domestic violence
- Chemical dependency issues
- Literal homelessness
- Physical disability
- Mental health concern

may qualify for Permanent Supportive Housing.

With Permanent Supportive Housing, you can stay on the program until you are ready to exit.
